

Course-Workshop The National System of Statistical and Geographic Information, SNIEG

Introduction:

In Mexico, in accordance with the LAW of the National Statistical and Geographical Information System (LSNIEG), the National Institute of Statistics and Geography (INEGI), as an organism with technical and management autonomy, legal personality and its own patrimony, is responsible for regulating and coordinating the National System of Statistical and Geographic Information (SNIEG), as well as the statistical and geographic activities carried out by the State Units in order to produce Information of National Interest.

The LSNIEG itself establishes that INEGI may carry out functions of support to the training and updating of the public servants of the State Units, to influence the training and improvement of the technical capacities of the members of the System.

One way of influencing the development of technical capacities is the dissemination and knowledge of the SNIEG and training in specific topics of interest.

In this sense, in this course taught by INEGI, the objective, concepts, organization, operation and interactions of the components of the National System of Statistical and Geographic Information in Mexico are described.

Objective:

At the end of the course, the participants will identify the legal, administrative and programmatic foundations that support the National System of Statistical and Geographic Information of Mexico, by characterizing its composition and interaction elements that contribute to meeting the objectives of the System, in order to provide elements to the public servants of the State Units for their participation in the SNIEG.

Online mode:

There is an online version of the course, for which the interested party is provided with a link to the course, their username and password so that they can have access to the content, evaluations and other materials.

Duration:

The course lasts 20 hours and the estimated time of daily dedication is two hours.

Learning activities:

Some tasks and exercises are requested, as well as the resolution of evaluations.

Participant profile:

Personnel of the State Units that carry out statistical and geographical activities within the framework of the SNIEG.

Participant role:

The participant is responsible for complying with the agenda by assigning the times that are most convenient for him to review the contents, resolve the evaluations that the course consists of, as well as express his doubts.

Evaluation:

Assessments distributed throughout the course are included. All of them prioritize the practical aspect of what has been learned.

The final grade will be obtained from the weighted average of the partial evaluations, where the minimum passing grade is 6.0.

Intercommunication:

The course has an online chat, as well as a form for the participant to express doubts or comments and a document in which they can find out the most Frequently Asked Questions.

Recognition document:

At the end of the course, a certificate of participation issued by INEGI-SNIEG is delivered to the participant via email.
